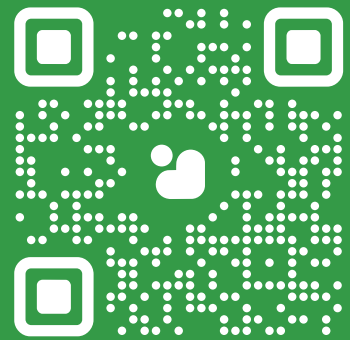

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DIGITAL DECEPTION

Staying one step ahead of fraudsters
in South Africa



In an increasingly digital and connected world, scammers are working just as hard as the rest of us – often harder. Their aim is simple: drain bank accounts, harvest personal data, or exploit urgency and confusion for financial gain. While many scams follow familiar patterns, fraudsters have become far more polished, frequently mimicking legitimate organisations convincingly enough to fool even cautious consumers.

One of the most common threats remains social engineering: phishing (email), smishing (SMS), and vishing (voice calls). These attacks typically involve criminals posing as banks, service providers or government departments. You might receive an SMS warning of ‘suspicious activity’ on your account, or a call from someone claiming to need to ‘verify’ your details. The message is almost always the same: act now.

The safest response? Slow down. Contact the institution directly using official contact details from its verified website or app – never through the link or number provided in the message.

Another scam doing the rounds involves fake traffic fine notifications. Motorists receive alarming messages via SMS, WhatsApp, or email claiming outstanding

finances must be paid immediately to avoid penalties or licence suspension. Fraudsters exploit that uncertainty by directing victims to cloned payment websites designed to capture banking details.

Red flags include threatening language, unfamiliar web addresses and unsolicited messages from unknown numbers. Always verify fines through official government platforms rather than clicking embedded links.

Investment scams are also thriving. Slick, professional-looking trading platforms promise impressive returns with minimal risk. Once funds are deposited, communication dries up, and the money vanishes. If returns sound too good to be true, they almost certainly are.

Similarly, job and work-from-home scams prey on economic pressure. Adverts promise generous pay for little effort, but require upfront ‘training’ or ‘verification’ fees. After payment, the opportunity evaporates – sometimes along with your identity details.

Online marketplaces present further risks. Fraudsters pose as buyers or sellers, pushing victims to transfer money outside secure payment systems. If a deal requires you to bypass official channels, walk away.

Across all these schemes, the warning signs are strikingly consistent: unsolicited contact, pressure to act immediately, requests for sensitive information, and suspicious web addresses. When in doubt, pause and verify independently with the supposed sender through official channels.

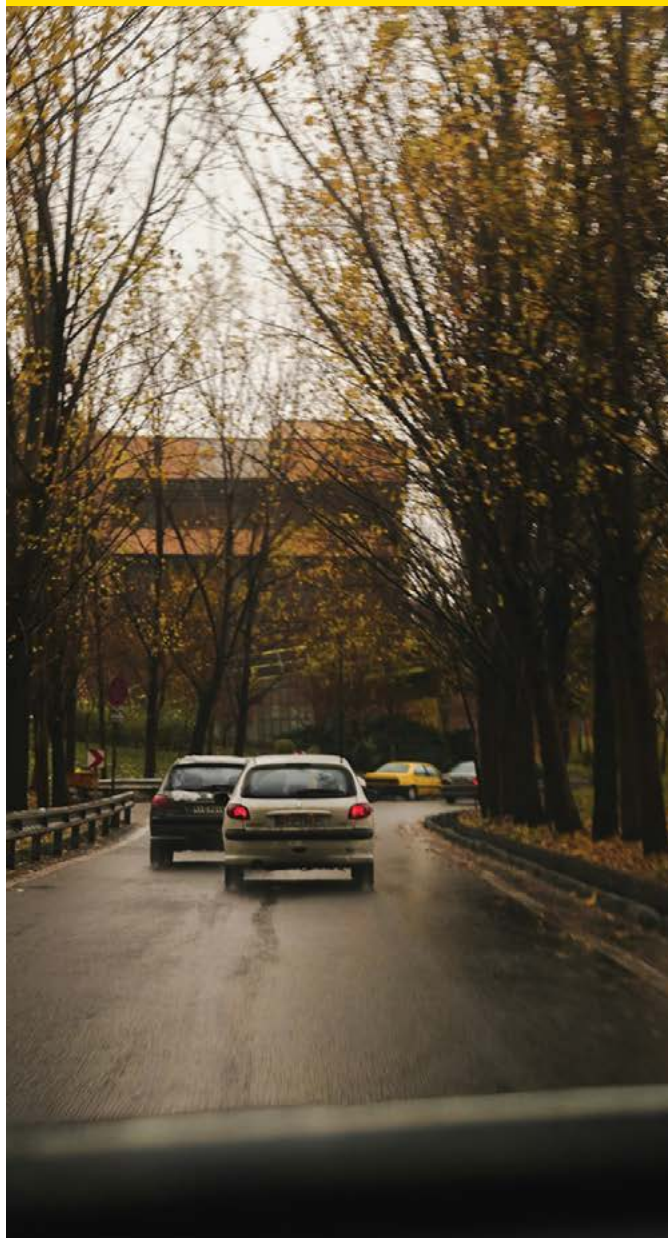
Scams evolve as quickly as technology, but awareness remains your strongest defence. A brief moment of caution today can prevent significant financial and emotional stress tomorrow.

Quick personal scam prevention checklist

- Pause before clicking on links or responding to messages from unknown sources.
- Verify any unexpected fines, investment opportunities or job offers through official websites or apps.
- Never share personal or banking information with unverified contacts.
- Keep devices and apps updated and use strong, unique passwords.
- Enable multi-factor authentication on financial and social accounts.
- Educate family and community members about common scams and red flags.
- Report suspicious contact to your bank, South African Revenue Service (SARS), or relevant consumer protection authorities.

FOLLOW-ME INCIDENTS

Follow-me incidents remain an ongoing concern. To help keep you and those with you safe, please follow these simple guidelines as you approach your destination.



Five minutes before arrival:

- Heighten your awareness and remain fully alert to your surroundings
- Put away your mobile phone to avoid distractions
- Lower the volume of your car radio or music
- Open both the driver's and front passenger windows slightly (approximately 3cm from the top)
- Pay attention to external sounds and listen for anything unusual
- Actively check all three mirrors – left, right and rear-view
- Take note of nearby vehicles and pedestrians
- Ask children to remain calm and quiet
- Request adult passengers to assist with observing the surroundings
- Reduce your speed gradually
- Keep your vehicle properly aligned with the road, parallel to your point of entry

Be alert to:

- Suspicious individuals
- Suspicious vehicles
- Unusual activity
- Unattended or suspicious objects

Do not enter if you notice:

- Unknown individuals loitering nearby
- Unfamiliar vehicles parked close to the entrance
- A security officer failing to provide a clear signal
- Unusual activity, such as emergency responders on site

If in doubt:

- Do not proceed into the premises
- Continue driving to a safe, well-lit and populated area
- Avoid stopping in isolated or poorly lit locations
- Contact site security or the relevant authority to report your concerns
- If you believe you are being followed, drive to the nearest police station or busy public space
- Keep your doors locked while you assess the situation
- Trust your instincts – if something does not feel right, prioritise your safety

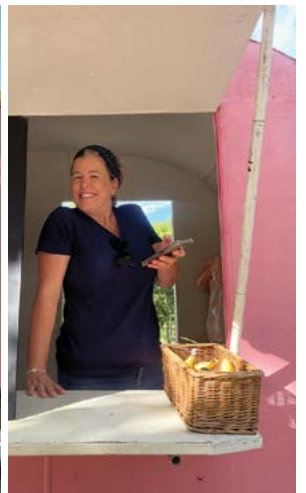
OUR INAUGURAL FARMER'S MARKET

CONFLICT RESOLUTION IN DOGS

BACKGROUND

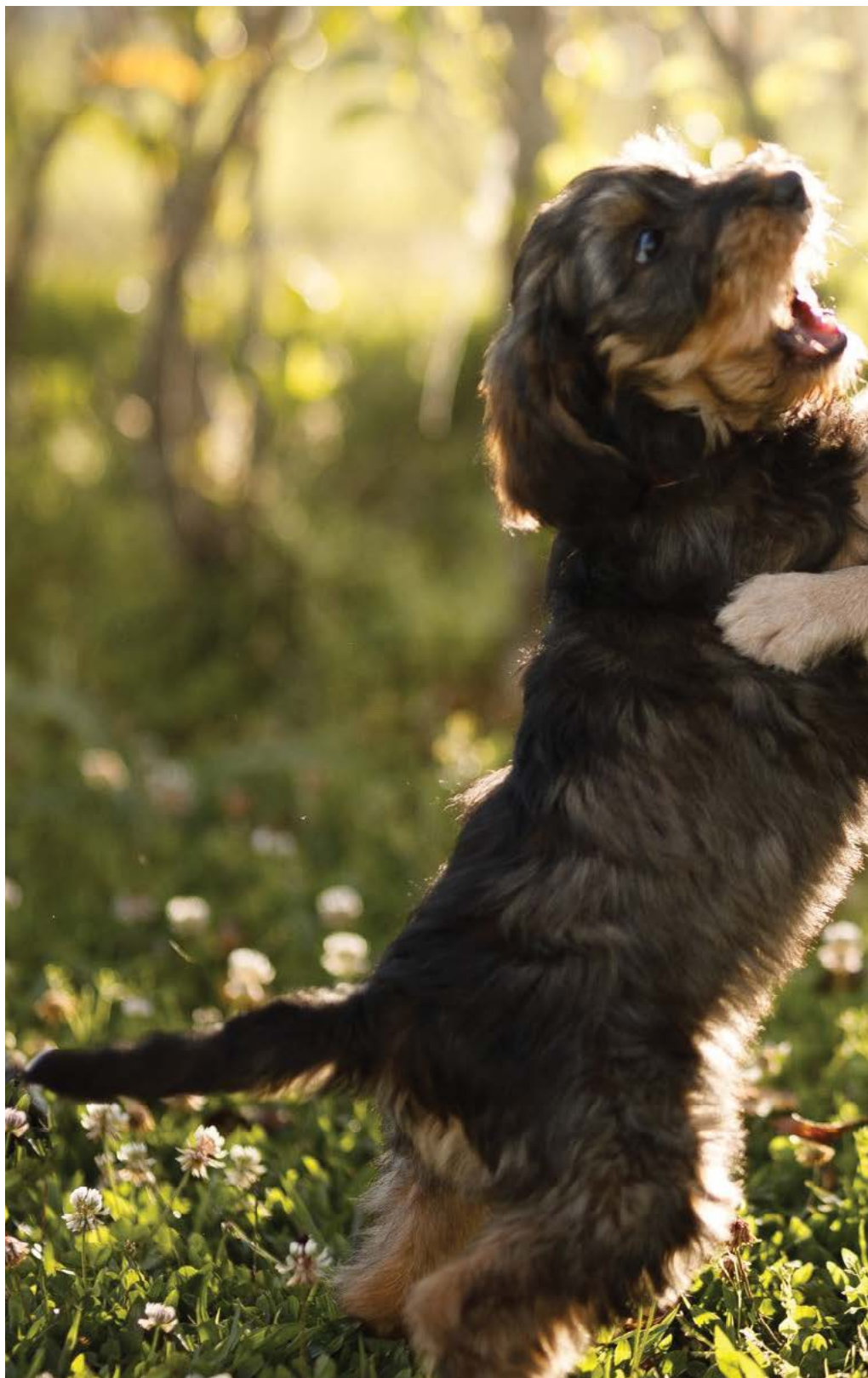
I recently had a case where a family was concerned that their new German Shepherd puppy would be attacked by one of their Rottweilers. The family are familiar with power breeds and have the required knowledge – they already have two Rottweilers and an adult German Shepherd. However, they were particularly worried about the interactions between their new puppy and the larger of the two Rottweilers. To avoid a potential tragedy, they had begun separating the dogs. When they were all at home, they would bring the dogs together but have the puppy in his crate and the large Rottweiler in a muzzle. The family was understandably on edge, and I was asked to assess the situation. I am giving the dogs fictitious names for ease of reading.

MEETING THE DOGS

After an initial interview in the lounge to gather the history of the situation, I asked to meet the dogs individually. The puppy, Ben, (around four or five months old) was delightful – boisterous, full of joy, playful, and keenly curious about the world. Ben is one of those super cute puppies with huge ears and paws. He was clearly loved and was able to get away with a few things, as only puppies can. Then entered Troy, a smallish, good, humoured Rottweiler, who happened to annoy his owner by immediately accepting a treat from me.

This came after a lengthy brief that my treats will have no effect, as they have taught all their dogs to not accept treats from strangers. One must love the power of the nose! I watched the interaction between Troy and Ben. What became clear almost immediately was how Ben bullied Troy. He nipped at his feet, pulled and chewed on his ears, bit his tail and jumped all over him. It was obvious to me that poor old Troy didn't feel like he had the situation under control at all. He was allowing himself to be bullied, was unable to discipline the puppy, and seemed miserable every time they interacted - like a hen-pecked husband.

Then I met Rex, the biggest Rottweiler I have ever seen. Truly a beautiful specimen that would send shivers down your spine if you didn't know he was coming. To say he was big may be an understatement. He was huge! Ben was placed into his crate, and



Rex, wearing a muzzle, quickly greeted me and moved on to interact with Troy. They had a great relationship with each other, and I could see that Rex wasn't fond of the puppy. As he had a muzzle on, I asked that Ben be let out of the crate so I could see

the body language and assess why Rex was reacting negatively to Ben.

OBSERVATION

The puppy, when released from the crate, ran straight for Troy. Nipping, biting,

and after observing all the above, I was beginning to see the picture. Ben had zero boundaries. Troy was stressed as he was constantly bullied and was unable to discipline Ben. Rex was stressed for two reasons: first, he had to wear a muzzle every time he saw the puppy, creating a negative association; and second, he felt compelled to intervene every time Ben bullied Troy.

I held my breath and made a decision to remove the muzzle. Then took all the dogs and family into the garden, walking around their large plot. The dynamic played out again. Ben bugging Troy, and Rex intervening on behalf of Troy. The good news was that the muzzle could be retired. I was confident that Rex was not going to bite or hurt Ben.

SUMMING UP

Troy needs to be exposed to more things in the world to give him more confidence. He is now going to training and has off lead walks in safe areas. Rex is very tired of having to shoulder the moderator role. He does not like Troy being bullied and has been most disciplined himself by not biting the puppy. In households where there is more than two dogs, it is useful to observe their behaviour to identify who naturally takes on the moderator role – there will always be one. Ben also needs to learn manners and boundaries and consequently, won't have to go back into the crate when Rex is around.

When I finished the consultation and said my goodbyes, I got into my car and closed the door. Troy unexpectedly and to the surprise of his owners, went for my front tyre; not biting but rushing up to it, barking and challenging it. In his own way, he was taking a stand, even if it was only against the tyre! The owners called me two days later to say that the dogs were all getting along and that they could go out without having to separate them. Troy is now telling the puppy when he has had enough. Rex can relax without having to moderate and Ben is learning his boundaries. We can facilitate conflict resolution in dogs once we understand why they are behaving the way they are.

jumping, chewing and pulling – I could immediately see Troy become stressed, feeling helpless and overwhelmed at the continuous badgering. Rex went straight towards the puppy and pinned him against the wall. The family immediately went to

grab Rex and pulled him away. Ben then went straight back to annoy Troy again and was then put back into the crate.

A viscous circle. All dogs were enduring their own stressors, the family was stressed



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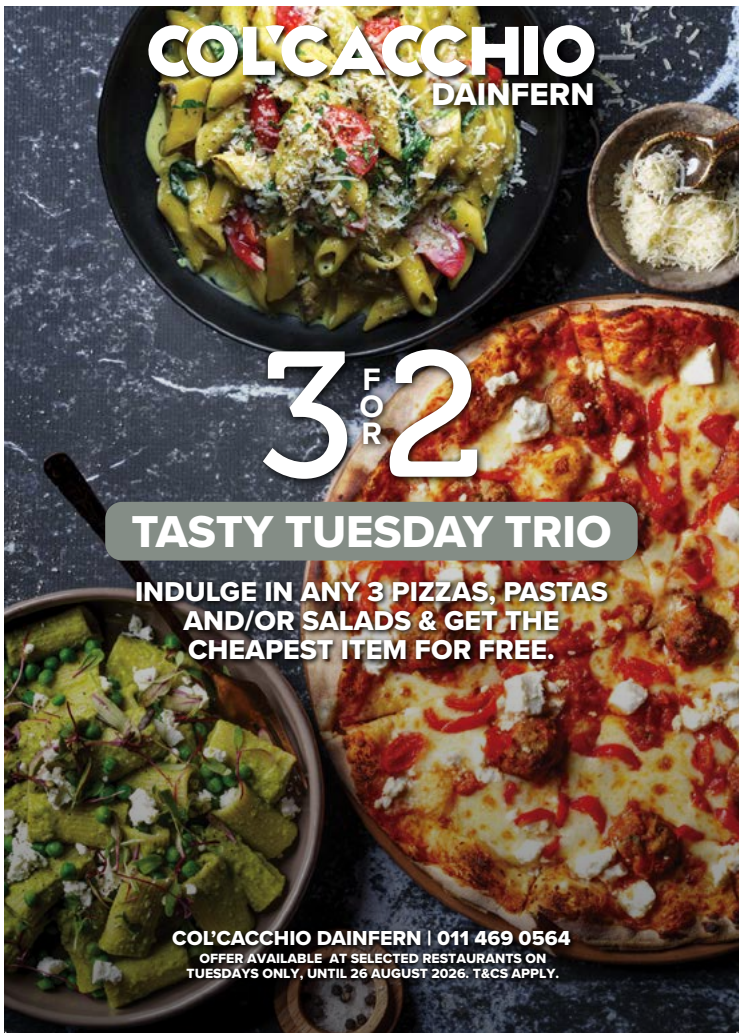
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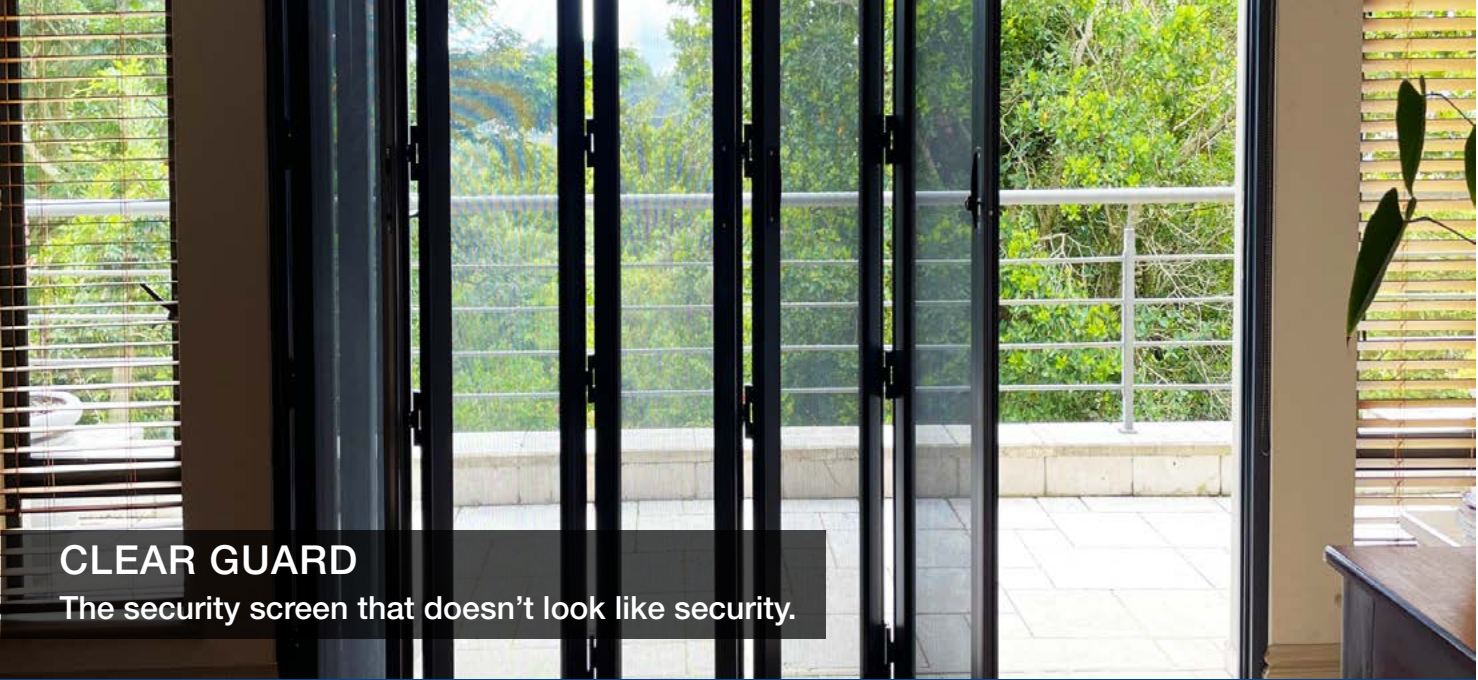
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WATER IS THE BOSS AT FOURWAYS GARDENS RESIDENTIAL ESTATE

At Fourways Gardens Residential Estate, one guiding principle is shaping the future of the river corridor: water is the boss. Water will always follow gravity, concentrate where it can, accelerate when confined, and erode what is left exposed. After the recent desilting of the river and dam system, the estate understood that restoring capacity was only the first step. Once sediment is removed, riverbanks are vulnerable and without careful rehabilitation, the next heavy rainfall can undo the progress made.

What makes Fourways Gardens stand out is its acceptance that river rehabilitation is not just about hard engineering, it is about working with natural systems. Instream vegetation such as indigenous reeds and sedges has been re-established to slow water movement and trap sediment before it travels downstream. Along the banks, deep-rooted indigenous grasses and shrubs are stabilising the soil below the surface, binding it together and reducing the risk of undercutting during peak flows. These root systems strengthen over time, providing a living form of reinforcement that adapts to seasonal changes.

The open grassed areas near the river are also playing an important role. When properly managed, healthy grass with strong root systems slows surface runoff and improves water absorption, acting as a natural overflow buffer during heavy rain. Strategic eco-barriers between hard surfaces and the water further filter runoff, improving water quality while supporting biodiversity. None of this is accidental, it reflects a deliberate decision to let ecological function guide design.

While the rehabilitation process is well underway, river systems are dynamic and certain high-pressure points still require intervention. The causeway above the dam, where water naturally concentrates during storms, will be the focus of further stabilisation work to strengthen the system's resilience. Watch this space!

By embracing the principle that water leads and design must follow, Fourways Gardens is not just restoring a river, it is building a more resilient landscape for the future.

TRADITIONAL HOMEMADE HOT CROSS BUNS

Recipe by Abigail Donnelly

Hot cross buns are a cherished treat, lovingly baked with warm spices and sweet dried fruits that fill the kitchen with a comforting aroma. Why not make your own traditional hot cross buns this Easter with this delicious recipe, and fill your home with the irresistible scent and warmth of freshly baked goodness?



Ingredients

480g flour
2 x 10g instant yeast sachets
10g brown sugar
½ tsp cinnamon
½ tsp nutmeg
Salt, a pinch
½ tsp baking powder
½ tsp bicarbonate of soda
1 lemon, zested
1 ¼ cups of milk
3 tbsp butter
2 free-range eggs
1 tsp vanilla extract
135g sultanas and raisins

For the flour paste:

125g flour
5 tbsp water

For the glaze:

65ml golden syrup
65ml boiling water

Method

Preheat the oven to 180°C.

To make the hot cross buns

- Combine the flour, yeast, brown sugar, cinnamon, nutmeg, salt, baking powder, bicarbonate of soda, lemon zest and dried fruit in a large mixing bowl.
- Place the milk and butter in a saucepan and heat gently until the butter has melted. Lightly whisk the eggs and vanilla together and add to the dry ingredients, along with the milk-and-butter mixture.
- Gently mix the dough using your hands or a wooden spoon until the mixture comes together.
- Turn the dough out onto a clean surface and knead for 10 minutes.
- Place in a lightly oiled bowl, cover with clingfilm and place in a warm spot for 1½ hours until doubled in size.

- After the dough has risen, knock it down to its original size and then roll into 12 evenly shaped buns.
- Place the buns on a greased baking tray and cover with clingfilm, leaving enough room for the buns to rise. Allow the buns to rise for another 30 minutes.

To make the flour paste

- Mix the flour and water together to form a smooth paste, place it in a Ziploc sandwich bag and cut off one of the corners to make a piping bag.
- Pipe a cross onto each bun and bake for 15 minutes, or until the buns are golden and cooked through. Glaze the buns while they are still hot.

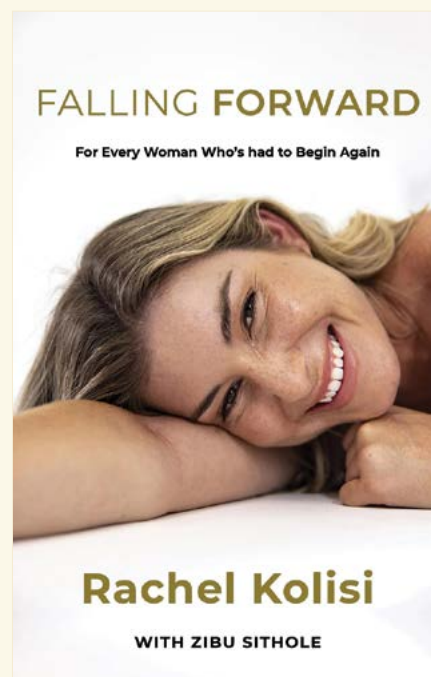
FALLING FORWARD
